Sports and Societies

Subsidisation and Accessibility from University Funding to improve student life! As well as Group and Team Facilities on Campus.

The cost of joining most societies and sports teams is high; by encouraging the university to help subsidise the cost, is one way we can improve student wellbeing and life on campus, this will give all students accessibility to all societies and sports teams, they would otherwise not be able to join because of financial restraints.

Furthermore, the relocation of students away from Castle Irwell sports grounds and the 'Pav', onto main campus accommodation has left the university sports teams, and activities groups without a common place to train, meet and compete. I would like to work with the university to provide the promised sports grounds on main campus (David Lewis grounds) to be fit for training and usage. As well as looking into the possibility of a long term project for changing rooms on the David Lewis grounds. But also the use of the sports facilities in media city to include as many students as possible in student society life.

Finally, I aim to reduce prices in the Student Union Bar and Café (Atmosphere). The SU has long been the centre of many social events. With reduced prices I wish to encourage more people to come to the student union and engage in more social events.

Housing Issues

Forcing the University to help lower the cost of student halls and following up a landlord/agency blacklist.

The CLV, IQ, Tramways and Kexgrill agency's to get them to look at a logical solution to decrease the financial difference between student finance allowance per term to monthly rent. As well as getting ideas from other student unions, to create our own find a flatmate/rate my landlord site on the Student Union website.

Other Issues

After being a student rep for 3 years and studying for 5 years here at Salford I have encountered many students in the college of Science and Technology. One of the main areas I get feedback on, is space for groups and friends to socialise and do work in during the day, usually between lectures. This is especially important for those who commute in.

This would be done by creating a free room timetable available online to be accessed via a click of the button.
