	3. A student who has opted-out of the Students' Union shall be termed a "User" until such time as they assume any form of membership which is defined within the Articles.
Rights & privileges	4. All members, be they Full Members, Associate members, Reciprocal, Life or Honorary Life Members of USSU are subject to the Regulations issued by the University and the Union from time to time.
Full Members	5. Full Members of the Union shall be entitled:
Full Members	5.1. To make use of any services and facilities of the Union;
	5.2. To hold ordinary membership of any Union club or society;
	5.3. To attend the Union Council and all Union committees as observers, except in such cases as are specified in these Bye-Laws;

Reciprocal, Life & Honorary Life Members	6. Reciprocal, Life and Honorary Life Members of the Union shall be entitled:
	6.1. To have restricted use of any services and facilities of the Union which may from time to time be available to them;
	6.2. To hold ordinary membership of any Union club or society; and
	6.3. To attend Annual and Extraordinary General Meetings of USSU as observers.
	All former Full Members are eligible to become Life Members. Any eligible person shall be granted Life Membership upon payment of a subscription free to be determined by the Trustees from time to time. Life members will have no voting rights within the Union.
	Ordinary members of Students' Unions affiliated to the National Union of Students shall be reciprocal members. Reciprocal membership may also be granted to other student organisations by the Trustees.
	Union Council may admit and remove Reciprocal, Life and Honorary Life members in accordance with the Bye-laws and guidance documents.
